ATTENDING CHAPEL SERVICES

WE warmly invite members of the public and the wider University to join us for our choral services. We enjoy the diversity of the congregations that gather day by day and are glad to welcome people of all faiths and none. Most services last at least three quarters of an hour, some longer—up to an hour and a quarter.

Most days, anything up to an hour before a service begins, a queue forms at the main entrance to College. Half an hour before the service, the College gate is opened and the queue moves forward. A quarter of an hour before the service, people are admitted to the Chapel itself. Five minutes before the service begins, the main gate of College is closed and, to ensure a calm and timely start to all our services, any who arrive later are not admitted.

Inside College there are three queues. The queue alongside the Chapel is the main one and is for members of the public. Members of the University are invited to queue on the north side of the Chapel. Only members and staff of King's College and School, and choir families, are invited to queue in front of the Gibbs' Building.

When you come to a service, please bear the following four points in mind:

- * We ask you not to bring any bag that is larger than airline hand-luggage size.
- * We ask that you take a seat in the Ante-chapel if you cannot commit to remaining for the whole service.
- * We do not allow recording or photography of any kind in services and strongly request that phones be turned off.
- * We regret that there are no public toilet facilities available in College.

If you or anyone attending with you has any additional needs that we might be able to help you with, or if you are coming in a group of ten or more people and wish to be seated together, or if you have any other questions about attending, please contact the Chapel Manager, whose details are printed on page 2.

The initials KC in this booklet are used to designate membership of King's College.

from THE DEAN

NEW DEAN OF CHAPEL

AFTER an extensive appointment process, the Governing Body has elected The Revd Canon Dr Hueston Finlay as the next Dean of Chapel. Dr Finlay is currently Vice-Dean of St George's Chapel, Windsor and Warden of St George's House. Before moving to Windsor in 2004, Hueston was Dean of Chapel and Director of Studies in Theology at Magdalene College and before that he was Chaplain at Girton College and Curate at Great St. Mary's. He will take up his duties early in 2026.

SIR STEPHEN CLEOBURY REMEMBERED

On Saturday 22 November we will mark the sixth anniversary of the death of our former Director of Music with a special Evensong for St Cecilia's Day. This coincides with the publication of a booklet celebrating his remarkable contribution as Director of Music and Fellow from 1982 to 2019 and the installation of a memorial tablet.

SERMONS AND ADDRESSES

This term we continue to explore the question of truth in our sermons at Matins with Professor Robert Foley, Leverhulme Professor of Human Evolution Emeritus, speaking on 12 October and Professor George van Kooten, Lady Margaret Professor of Divinity, considering questions of truth as they relate to reconciliation after war and conflict on Remembrance Sunday. On 28 September at the Sunday morning service I will speak about Benjamin Whichcote, perhaps the most remarkable and influential of all the Provosts of King's. Visiting preachers at communion services are The Revd Canon Anna Macham, Canon Precentor at Salisbury Cathedral, Father Luke Bell kc, monk of Quarr Abbey and The Revd Dr Victoria Johnson, Dean of Chapel and Fellow at St John's College, Cambridge.

Non-scriptural readings at Evensong on Mondays & Wednesdays

AT Evensong on Mondays and Wednesdays, the second reading is taken from a non-scriptural source. This term we are using *Writing the Icon of the Heart: In Silence Beholding* by Maggie Ross, which is the pen-name of Martha Reeves (born 1941). A former professor of theology, she has taken religious vows as an Anglican solitary, substantially withdrawing from general society in order to devote herself to prayer, worship and study. She divides her time between Oxford and the United States.

Perhaps Ross's strongest emphasis is on the importance of silence, and developing our relationship with it. Writing the Icon of the Heart: In Silence Beholding is especially strong on this.

This book's subtitle—In Silence Beholding—introduces another of her key concepts: 'beholding', which is partly about our own state of attention or being. Beholding normally requires us to hold ourselves 'open for reality to impinge on us'. It is 'organic, ungrasping and self-emptying'. It is also about encountering things which are beyond our control. Beholding stands in marked contrast to the task-centred and focused modes of attention, often driven by our own agenda, in which we are so often centred.

Ross sees neither silence nor beholding as inherently religious, but acknowledges that it can be hard to even begin to express the depths of what they enable without recourse to religious metaphors. Moreover, Ross convincingly offers the lens of beholding to illuminate many of the pivotal encounters in the pages of the Christian Bible. Indeed, the language of beholding is widespread within the King James Version which we normally use in Chapel.
